

# Create your own emergency action timeline



An emergency action timeline is a representation of what actions you should take when faced with typhoons, heavy rain, or other natural disasters. Research the level of risk of your surroundings and confirm where your nearest shelter is, when to evacuate and what you need to take with you.

## Let's consider a decentralized evacuation

Since a large number of people may gather at an evacuation center during a disaster, please consider the following points.

- (1) Consider establishing a safe place other than a shelter, such as a relative's or a friend's home.
- (2) If you are safe at home, consider sheltering in place at home (e.g., vertical evacuation to the second floor).

- If you have not already evacuated then please do so immediately.
- If it is unsafe to evacuate outside, secure your own safety inside the building.

### Evacuation important points

#### ● Preparation list

- Confirm the weather on the TV etc.
- Confirm evacuation shelter location and course of travel
- Confirmation of emergency supplies (back side)
- Prepare medicine for any chronic illnesses
- Charge mobile phone
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#### ● Evacuation checklist

- Confirm whether the evacuation shelter is open or not
- Ensure that all doors/windows are locked and reduce any potential fire hazards when evacuating your home
- Take your emergency evacuation bag with you
- Wear comfortable shoes and clothing that offer a good range of movement when evacuating
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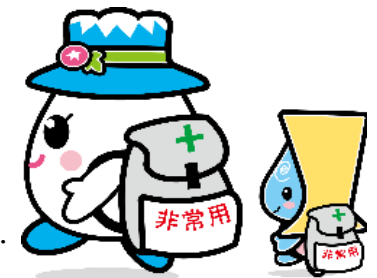
### Evacuation complete

- Contact family and relatives etc. about your current situation.



# Emergency Supplies Checklist

- Keep emergency items in a backpack-type bag (emergency bag) that can be used with both hands.
- Keep it light and compact as to not be a hindrance during an evacuation.
- Choose what you and your family need based on your situation.
- Prioritize what you need and prepare accordingly.
- Check the contents regularly.

## ● Valuables

- Cash  
(10-yen and 100-yen coins for public pay phones)
- Spare keys for car or house
- Spare eyeglasses, contact lenses, etc.
- Bank account number, life insurance policy number, etc.
- Health insurance card
- Identification papers  
(drivers license, My Number card, etc.)
- Personal seal
- Mother and child health notebook

## ● Information Technology Tools

- Cell phone (including a charger)
- Portable radio (including spare batteries)
- Photo of your family (in case you are separated)
- Emergency contact information for family, relatives, and friends
- Hazard map
- Comprehensive disaster prevention map
- Writing utensils

## ● Items for Hygiene and Health

- First-aid kit
- Household medicine and prescription medicine  
(medication notebook)
- Towel
- Toilet paper
- Change of clothes (including underwear)
- Wet tissues
- Masks
- Disinfectant solution
- Soap/Hand Soap
- Thermometer

## ● Food, etc.

- Emergency rations
- Drinking water

## ● Useful Items, etc.

- Disaster prevention hoods and helmets
- Flashlight (including spare batteries)
- Whistle or buzzer  
(one that makes a sound to let people know where you are)
- Utility knife
- Portable toilet
- Disposable heating packs
- Plastic bags
- Aluminum thermal insulation sheets
- Blanket
- Slippers
- Work gloves or leather gloves
- Matches/lighter
- Water supply bag
- Rain gear (rain coat, rain boots, etc.)
- Picnic blanket
- Tabletop stove (gas canister)

## ● Other Items

- Disposable diapers  
(for infants, elderly, etc.)
- Feminine hygiene products
- Powdered milk, baby bottles, etc.  
(items needed for babies)
- Other items essential to your life
